Monica Events

Monica Fall Social

This is the first activity of each new school year. It is a fun evening of food and fellowship where we welcome new parents to OCCS. This is the only time Monica meets together in a large group. The president leads an informal business meeting, the treasurer gives the yearly report and information is given on upcoming fundraisers. Officers are announced for the new term that begins in October.

Cookie Walk

We will be having a Cookie Walk on the first Saturday of December in the basement of Iowa State Bank. Each family will have the opportunity to get in the Christmas spirit and provide delectable holiday cookies and treats for our Cookie Walk, which is open to the public. The sights, sounds, and smells of Christmas will welcome patrons to those festive event. Tables are filled with a colorful variety of holiday cookies. Your taste buds will be tempted as you can walk along and pick up exactly the treats you want! This event is a great time for festive fun and fabulous fellowship as we begin the Christmas season.

Soup Supper

The annual Monica Soup Supper is held in late January or early February. This event is an opportunity to enjoy food and fellowship with friends, family, neighbors and the community. The meal consists of several kinds of soup, hot dogs, tavern, pies, and desserts. Three work groups are asked to work and all Monica Members are asked to bring soup or tavern. Recipes for soup and tavern are provided. Either your work group chairperson will contact you or detailed information will be in the Home Bulletin.

<u>Pig-in-the-Blankets</u>

In the spring Monica members are asked to make thousands of pig-in-the-blankets. These are used for the two Monica Tulip Festival stands. This is a unique item that draws many people to our Festival stands. The Pig-In-the-Blanket committee is in charge of organizing this event along with finding workers to bake the pigs at the Tulip Festival and deliver them to each stand throughout each day. All Monica members participate one of the two nights of making pig-in-the-blankets. Pigs left over after Tulip Festival are kept frozen and can be purchased throughout the year by contracting a committee member.

<u>Tulip Festival</u>

The Monica Society tent at the Tulip Festival is the biggest fundraiser for the school and takes the full cooperation from each member. The tent is located on the Iowa State Bank parking lot. We have two serving lines: ala carte with soups, tavern, hot dogs, pig-in-the-blankets, pies, and Pizza Ranch Chicken/mashed potatoes/ coleslaw. Each Monica member works a shift of a few hours some time during the Festival (either parent can take this shift). Some of the jobs available are cashier, serving, dishwashing, cutting pies, serving drinks, and waitressing. Members are also asked to bring pies to the Festival stand. Monica also sponsors a stand in the Straatmarkt. It serves almond bars and pig-in-the-blankets. It is chaired by Monica members, but the workers are generally associate members or friends of the school.

Year Round Monica Projects

Apparel/Promotional Sales

The Apparel/Promotional Sales committee market stylish shirts to help promote OCCS in the community as well as generate pride and support for our school and its students. Currently the committee is selling T-shirts, metal water bottles, and cookbooks. They are available while supplies last. The committee chooses the clothing item and style to be made available for the school year as well as what design to be screen printed on the shirts. They will then advertise the clothing, take orders and distribute the items to those ordering them. Clothing items can be viewed in the school office.

Labels For Learning and Box Tops for Education

Labels for Learning is a fundraiser that encourages all parents, grandparents and friends of OCCS to collect the needed labels for which money or equipment is given. These labels are redeemed for free product merchandise or cash directly to our school. Two main projects are Campbell's labels and General Mills Box Tops. Parents and friends of OCCS can clip the labels and send them along to school with their children or bring them into the school office. The Labels for Learning committee has a contest each semester as to which class can turn in the most labels and box tops. The Home Bulletins will contain updated lists of items that need to be saved.

Grade Level Coordinator Administrator (GLC)

The GLC Committee will organize a grade level coordinator (GLC) for each classroom at fall registration and provide ongoing support for GLC's throughout the school year. They will update a profile folder for each teacher for the GLC's to use as a reference, provide information regarding Duty Free Lunches (DFL) and information on use of classroom funds for gifts for teachers.

<u>Kitchen Committee</u>

The kitchen committee annually cleans coffee pots and roasters, organizes and keeps inventory in the Monica Building twice a year, coordinates with OCCS head cook for use of OCCS supplies and equipment, and manages the use of Monica equipment by outside groups (i.e. church use of coffee pots, etc.)
